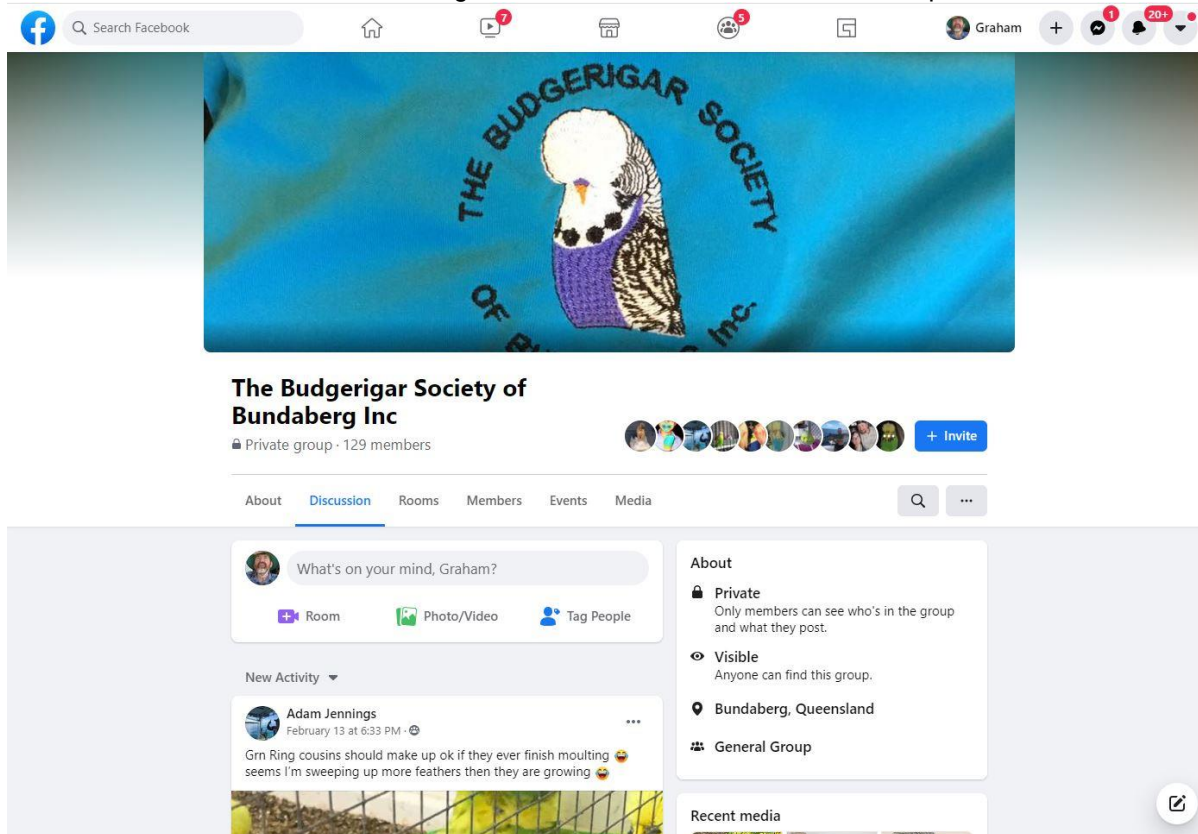

## Do you know your friends? A case study amongst bird groups on social media

### Background

2020 has been a crazy year for many people, including bird enthusiasts. Meetings, sales, expos, aviary tours and major events including Finches 20, Spring into Finches and Softbills 20 were cancelled. While many bird enthusiasts were already part of large social media congregations, 2020 saw an increase in digital platforms including Zoom Meetings for bird clubs and we even had an online auction by the Finch Society of Australia in December 2020. Overall, the use of social media amongst bird enthusiasts is without a doubt a positive benefit to our hobby.



Stepping back to 2019, it was quietly announced that PETA had become a major shareholder of Facebook<sup>1</sup>. It wasn't too long after this announcement in mid-2019, that many animal groups and communities were found to be the subject of increased scrutiny relating to Facebook's Community Guidelines which were updated to prohibit the sale of animals. Multiple groups that I was a member of, or an administrator of, were disabled and admins were notified of "Breaches to Community Guidelines" to allow them the opportunity to review the rule breaking. These were predominately about posts mentioning the words "sale", "wanted", "trading"; basically, anything relating to animal ownership. In many cases, groups were shut down by Facebook without notice to their admins. From the onset, it did appear that bird groups were being targeted. Groups such as the Aussie Finches for Aussie Breeders group were first given an opportunity to "clean-up" the group, and then after a review, the group was reactivated by Facebook. Sounds a simple process, but from my discussion with one of the groups moderators, this took about a week for the moderation team! No easy task given that all of them work and they had to physically scroll through tens of thousands of posts and delete where necessary. Even after such an extensive review by the moderation team, Facebook then deleted this group without notice. A hugely successful Aussie finch group with as many as 3,500 members and as many as 35,000 interactions each week was lost. The sharing of knowledge between members gone forever!

At the time, conspiracy theories were ripe. The most popular theories at the time where, 1) Was it PETA's influence as a major shareholder that directly shut these groups down? Or 2) Was there a "mole" among us reporting posts and groups to Facebook or 3) Was it just a smart algorithm at work targeting animal type groups? I guess we will never know the truth, but anyone who experienced this first hand knows the devastation and disconnection it caused amongst bird enthusiasts.

Moving into 2020, we know that other animal groups also suffered a similar fate. Dog, cat, reptile and even fish groups were also being targeted, with many groups and the information contained within them lost forever.

### Who are our Facebook friends?

Wondering about how we came to this situation, I wanted to test a theory. How trusting are we? Do we as bird enthusiasts know who our Facebook “friends” are? I thought that I would test this by creating a profile with an assumed name. The profile I created was for a Mr Curtis Simonsen. My goal was simple. To see how many Facebook “friends” I could obtain in a 24-hour period, as well as how many bird groups I could easily become a member of within the same period. So not to create any bias, I personally was not a “friend” of Mr Simonsen.

### Friend requests and joining groups

Mr Simonsen went about making friend requests and within an hour, had amassed quite a few with no rejection. Within the 24 hours “he” had gained a total of 287 friends from 290 friend requests, all of which were bird enthusiasts and all of which were located within Australia. From the three that did not accept the friend request, two people did question who I was. My standard response was, “I just joined Facebook (which I had) and I think we met at Finches 17 in Brisbane”. One person agreed and accepted my request, while the other replied that they were not at Finches 17. The remaining friend request resulted in my profile being blocked, so they clearly did not know who I was and made a decision to block me.

At the point of 12 hours into the experiment, I decided to join many of the bird groups on Facebook. These including multiple specialist parrot, finch, budgerigar and softbill groups. Each application to join was approved without question, even though my profile pic was of an old church and my cover photo an old bridge. Not one reference to birds was in my profile, and I had been a member of Facebook for less than 24 hours. I joined virtually all Australian bird groups within the 24-hour period.

Of these groups, I am personally an active member of three of these, including being an administrator of one (although I did not approve Mr Simonsen as a member, another admin did), so I will use these three groups as examples. At the end of the 24-hour period, of my 287 friends, 98 were also members of “Aussie Finches for Aussie Breeders”, 75 were also members of “Byrnes Aviaries” and 45 were also members of “Australian Softbill Community”.

### What does this mean?

For me personally, this result demonstrates a couple of things. Firstly, we may have forgotten that any of our Facebook “friends” can see everything we ever have or ever will post, any posts you are tagged in by someone else, and perhaps even who your family or other friends are depending on your privacy settings. We already know that our digital footprint is wide and far and has been shown in some cases to have a negative impact on job searching<sup>2</sup>. Secondly, the results of this short study may also suggest that our hobby is particularly vulnerable to infiltration by members of animal rights groups, any organisation or even government regulatory authority. To obtain masses of friends in such a short period of time with virtually no resistance is concerning, and I would hope that any person, bird enthusiast or not, should be cautious in who they accept “friend” requests from on social media. Indeed, Facebook itself states that you should only accept friend requests from people that you know and trust<sup>3</sup>. While no one “knew” Mr Simonsen, it could be assumed that as he started to obtain many mutual friends, that this was deemed acceptable even though they were not known.

Many Facebook groups have implemented numerous measures since the dramas of mid to late 2019 including making groups closed or private, and having questions that must be answered relating to group membership to minimise potential intrusions. Many groups have also taken sales to different platforms to get around the Facebook Community Guidelines. MeWe appears to be the choice of many bird and reptile groups, however it is uncertain whether these will be suitable in the future. Perhaps the bricks and mortar avicultural societies will make a comeback? I for one, have been a member of many official clubs for years including the Finch Society of Australia and

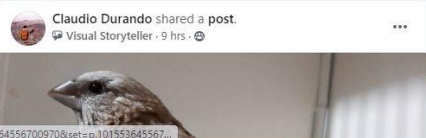

### What next?

I don't want people to be scared of social media! In fact, it is well recognised that social media has massive benefits for networking, collaborating and general discussion by connecting bird enthusiasts from within Australian and around the globe. We have learnt, and we will continue to learn and share information amongst each other, and Facebook Groups are a perfect way to facilitate these connections and sharing of information. You can still be a member of Facebook Groups and through these groups, you can ask questions, share breeding results, post pictures of your birds and aviaries; the things that we all love to do and we love to see of fellow bird enthusiasts. I always remember on the Aussie Finches for Aussie Breeders site (the original group before it was shutdown) the amazing story of a father and his son, and how great birds were as part of his therapy. In the end, many members of the group donated birds to this family in Victoria and helped even put an aviary together! The admin of the group where overwhelmed with finch breeders wanting to help! And that's the type of people we are – we are a community! We do want to help each other and want to encourage new people to our hobby! And we should never ever stop doing that! Don't be afraid of social media!

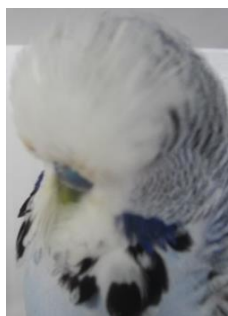
What I would suggest is that you review your "Friends" list.
